What's an E3?

An E3 is not a tax form. It is not a new Mercedes Benz series. It is not E to the third power.

E3 is a team of creative church consultants with a passion for bringing vitality and revitalization to congregations. The mission of E3 is to walk with congregations by engaging in spiritual conversations to discover and discern God's vision, to bring excitement into ministries through learning modules and spirit-filled exercises, and to realize growth, change, and transformation.

We have called upon the services of E3 to encourage and equip us in an aspect of ministry which is largely missing at Lincolnshire—faith sharing. We are a welcoming community, but not an inviting one. The single most important aspect of church growth is extending invitations. People who are not invited to church and to the Christian faith do not come. It's hard to welcome people who aren't here! To some Christians, offering invitations and sharing faith in a winsome, non-threatening way comes naturally. For most of us it does not. Sharing our stories is a learned behavior that takes time, practice and encouragement.

The key words of the E3 faith sharing module are, **Embody... Entrust... Evangelize.** The goal is to help us grow in spirit, in courage, and in numbers by building relationships with others and finding words for your faith. Everyone has a bad evangelism story. We know about the methods that don't work, but the combination of Jesus' Good News and great relationships will unleash vibrant life.

Beginning in February, a consultant/coach will lead us through a two-month learning process. It will include church school classes, small groups, worship services, and learning skills. The textbook for the faith sharing module is written by Jeremy Ashworth. Preceding these activities there will be a prayer emphasis as we ask God to prepare our hearts and minds to be open, receptive, and involved in this important opportunity.

Further information will be shared over the next four Sundays. The success of E₃ at Lincolnshire will depend upon two things—God's blessing and the involvement of everyone in the church family. The first is a done deal. The second? That's up to you!
