The Fall Love Feast October 26 at 6:30

Twice a year, Brethren celebrate what the earliest Christians called *agape*: the outflowing love that seeks not to receive but to give. Jesus taught us this practice when he shared with his disciples a last, loving meal the night before he died. He washed their feet, ate supper with them, drew them closer into the fold of his love and offered them the symbolic bread and cup.

During Love Feast, we repeat these simple meaningful acts. We lovingly wash each other's feet, which reminds us that no person ought to be greater than another. Love has no need to prove status or position; it simply gives—and keeps on giving. This act also reminds us that everyone needs loving attention and that we can offer that service to others. We then enjoy a meal together. Quietly, we share communion, the bread and the cup that remind us of Jesus' great gift. We renew our commitment to follow his example of sacrificial love.

Love Feast closes with a hymn; then follows the humble task of cleaning up, in which we are *all* invited to participate. When we leave the feast, reunited in our dedication to Christ and to each other, the deep nourishing love goes with us. It serves as a constant reminder that we can help give God's blessings to others; through steady, loving service, symbolically washing the feet of the world.
