

Christmas, 2014...what can you give?

The core principle of **Heifer USA** and **Heifer International** is <u>Passing on the Gift</u>. For each livestock gift, families agree to pass on the offspring of that animal to another person in need. In some places, <u>22</u> generations of Heifer animals can be traced. On average, Passing on the Gift lasts for at least nine generations.

A **Heifer USA** Gift Certificate shows a gift has been given in someone's name. Make an offering to Heifer USA and indicate it is for a Gift Certificate. Put the check in the offering plate or give it to Peggy Brown, Judy Steckly, or anyone in the office. The Gift Certificate will be ready the next week, or sooner, if needed. There are also gift boxes for donations which will accumulate and be given to **Heifer USA** by Lincolnshire. The boxes are located in the Fellowship Hall, the back of the sanctuary, and on the kitchen counter.

Giving for the month of October totaled \$11,602 and expenses were \$10,271 resulting in an addition to our balance of \$1,331. We operate on a cash basis and there are some commitments such as outreach, pensions, etc. that are paid quarterly. This will give us some funds towards meeting these December commitments.

On a year-to-date basis, giving totaled \$121,812 and expenses exceeded this amount by \$5,351 which has eroded the beginning balance. Please continue to support the church financially so we can end the year with a sufficient working balance.

We appreciate all the giving and support from each of you and your commitment makes it possible for Lincolnshire to continue doing God's work.
