There was a popular song titled, "Let It Snow, Let It Snow, Let It Snow." I spoke with some people who prayed that we would have snow for Christmas. Now some of these same people are saying, "Enough is enough!" In my opinion, we have had enough snow to enjoy its beauty and enough zero temperatures to destroy all the nasty bugs and germs that may plague us. So if you were one of those folks who prayed for snow, would you now please pray for an early spring with enough rain to bring the trees and plants back to life?

It is thought by some that snow is free because we don't pay to have it delivered. However....the cost comes later with repairing crashed autos, purchasing shovels and other snow equipment and paying higher than normal heating bills. While Lincolnshire doesn't have to repair or purchase snow blowers and other equipment, we *DID* pay for having the parking lot and driveway cleared. Normally we budget \$600 per year for snow removal and salt (if required). But in 2013, we spent \$889 and <u>shot</u> right through the budget! For the year 2014, another \$600 was approved for snow removal. *Guess what!?* In January, we spent \$585 and then....we got another 8 inches or more of snow in the first of February! So the cost to clear the drive and parking lot will be at least another \$100.

Now there are two ways you can help. One way is to pray for an early spring. The other way is to put some money in a pew envelope marked "Snow Removal" and put it in the offering plate. Personally, when I think of how long it would take all of us to do all that shoveling, putting some money in the offering plate pays greater dividends! Thanks! ~ Marv Loutsenhizer

Lifetouch photographers say, "Be Yourself!" Dress can be classic, casual, sporty, fun....it's up to you. Here are some tips:

- Solid colors work best. Avoid busy patterns, they distract from your face.
- Avoid changing your hairstyle or cutting your hair right before your setting.
- If you are wearing special jewelry, mention to the photographer that you would like to have your jewelry featured in the portrait.
- Apply make-up as you normally would for an evening out. Remember: your eyes are the focal point in a portrait.
- If you wear glasses all the time, you'll want to have them in your portrait.
- Lifetouch offers portrait retouch that can soften lines, etc.
