Maundy Thursday, April 17 6:30 p.m. Love Feast

During Love Feast, we repeat simple, meaningful acts of love of God and each other. We celebrate agape: the outflowing love that seeks not to receive but to give. Jesus taught us this practice, sharing with his disciples a last, loving meal the night before he died.

We begin by lovingly washing each other's feet. By including the service of footwashing in our love feast, we honor Jesus' lesson that no person ought to be greater than another. First we humbly accept attention and care from the one who washes our feet. Then we, in turn, wash someone else's feet. After each act of footwashing, we embrace and share a simple phrase of blessing.

We then enjoy a simple meal together. Quietly, we share communion, the bread and the cup reminding us of Jesus' great gift as we renew our commitment to follow his example of sacrificial love.

In the sharing of the Love Feast, we remember as followers of Jesus, we can help share God's blessing to others –through steady, loving service, symbolically washing the feet of the world. Please join us on April 17th as we unite in our dedication to Christ and to each other.
