Northern Indiana District Board Meeting on May 15

The District Board will be meeting at Lincolnshire on Thursday, May 15. A time of sharing with the Board, our Leadership Team and other members of Lincolnshire will be from 6:45 – 7:15 p.m. This gives you the opportunity to meet the District Board and you are invited to attend.



We swvived the severe winter and are now enjoying the warm days that May is providing! So here is an update on where we are financially and where your giving dollars are at work. Our January reported giving was weak but was better in February, stronger in

March and down a little in April. To be specific:

For the first four months of 2014 (January through April), our Expenses exceeded our Giving by \$1,999.31. For this same period, Expenses totaled \$50,847 and Giving totaled \$48,8467.

In working with the Property Management Team, we were made aware that the estimated repair and maintenance work needed for the next month or so on our parking lot will be about \$4,300. Work also needs to be done on the big stained glass window (the window which is behind the altar). This window leaks during heavy downpours and causes flooding behind the chancel area. Although these items are in the budget, we will need additional funding to help pay the bills.

The Stewardship Team really appreciated your extra contributions for additional costs incurred for the many extra hours of snow plowing. But in order to maintain the parking lot and to prevent it from breaking up, we need your help paying for these repairs. If you are not quite up to date in meeting your pledge, please consider catching it up. If you can redirect some of your tax refund dollars or other money to the church, that also would be appreciated. The offering plates will hold the extra on Sunday mornings! Thank you so very much for your support of the church by your prayers, your donation of time and talents, your attendance and your financial support.
