

Get Out and Vote Next Sunday!

On July 19 thirty-one people participated in our second workshop led by our E3 consultant,



Randy Yoder. During the day-long event we walked through neighborhoods in the 46806 and 07 zip codes noting our observations, greeting people, and praying for the families who live there. We assessed the needs of our neighbors based upon demographic information of the communities around the church. We reviewed the conclusions made by Randy based upon the surveys you completed. (Copies of his findings are in your mail slots.) From this information we created five goals:

Community Goals:

- We will make ourselves known to our community through service ministries.
- Hospitality is our strength. We will reach out to our neighbors and develop friendships through regular trash pick up days.

Congregational Goals:

- We will develop and pray for a spirit of abundance.
- We will develop deeper relationships among ourselves.
- Because of our strengths, possibilities and potential, we agree to lovingly address the issue of conflict through a biblical model of conflict resolution (Matthew 18: 15-20).

Following worship on **August 10**th, you will be asked to select one goal from each category. Your two selections will be the primary focus of our congregation's ministry in 2014-15. Plan to be in church next Sunday and help us in this important discernment process.

Recently, I was asked when we were going to quit talking about money. I replied that I wish we could, but if we don't communicate the need for additional giving, many may think that the church has more funds than is actually needed. And that is simply not happening this year.
