

## CHRISTMAS PREPARATIONS BEGIN DECEMBER 4<sup>th</sup>

Advent, which means, "coming," is the season of the church year when Christians prepare to celebrate Jesus' birth. In anticipation of Christmas, Christians often decorate their churches and homes with symbols. Many families use special Advent calendars with "doors" to open -- one per day until Christmas. Each door may suggest a Bible reading and a family activity. Families may sing carols, light an Advent



wreath, say a prayer or read a brief Christmas story. Preparing for Christmas at home is a joyful tradition that draws family members close to God and to each other.

On Sunday morning, **December 4**, Lincolnshire will also prepare for Advent with a special service that celebrates the Holy Season with **the Hanging of the Greens**. With the lighting of the Advent candle, carols in the air, holly and candles in the windows, wreaths on the front panels, poinsettias aflame with brilliant color, a Christmas tree awaiting gifts and the congregation of family and friends, we will begin our season of Advent.

Author and radio host Garrison Keillor put a unique spin on expressing gratitude for special meals. He painted the following table prayer on his dining-room wall, encouraging guests to sing it together before eating:

O Lord, we thank Thee for this food, For every blessing, every good. For earthly sustenance and love Bestowed on us from heaven above. Be present at our table, Lord. Be here and everywhere adored. Thy children bless and grant that we May feast in paradise with Thee.

"It's inspiring to hear 15 people find harmony around the Thanksgiving table," Keillor writes. "Singing together 'sets a tone'. No crying in the cranberries... There is much to be grateful for."
