

#### Advent, then and now

The church season of Advent began as a time of repentance for Epiphany, which was the second-biggest baptism day in the early church. Fasting was once a part of Advent, as it often still is for Lent.

Advent comes from the Greek word *Parousia* which was often used to talk about Jesus' second coming. So Advent is a season of preparation not only for the celebration of Jesus' earthly birth but for his promised return. Some Christians celebrate Advent by not putting the baby Jesus into their manger scenes until Christmas morning. This adds to the anticipation that is a special part of the season.

Reports from Ministry Teams were accepted.

Treasurer's Report—Marilyn Drudge: General Fund shows a negative balance of \$5,704. A Quarterly Report is posted on bulletin board, and Stewardship Team will address ways to handle the deficit.

Budget: Bob Kaylor presented the challenge budget of \$119,391. Pledges are \$116,972. Expenses for interim pastor are calculated at ¾ time and the amount of \$54,214 includes all pastoral expenses. Budget was approved.

Pastor David's report included reflections on ministry, appreciation for the many people he's known, and the privilege of sharing in significant moments in others' lives. He reviewed protocol for pastor and congregation from the Code of Ethics. Meeting was adjourned. Notes by *Carolyn Egolf*
